Your Present Approval is for:

Non-compliance samples for analytes and test methods as cited on the attachment to your enclosed Nebraska certificate are based on the California Department of Public Health, effective date January 1, 2007 which you provided with your application.

This Certification authorizes testing of only Nebraska private drinking water samples and non-compliance drinking water samples. In order to test compliance samples from Public Water Systems in Nebraska, your Laboratory must enter an agreement with the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health. 
